College of Fisheries, Mangaluru (KVAFSU, Bidar) in collaboration with National Institute of Agriculture Extension Management (MANAGE), Hyderabad, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Government of India, ICAR-KVK, DK organizing one month training program on “Aquaclinics and Aquapreneurship Development Program” during 21.01.2019 to 19.02.2019 at College of Fisheries, Mangaluru.

India is a 7th largest country in the world and possesses vast aquatic resources yet to be tapped to their fullest potential. The present fish production of India is 11.6 million tons (mt) where 4.11 mt comes from marine sector and 7.49 mt from freshwater. The present per capita consumption is 11.8 kg as against World Health Organization’s recommendation of 18 kg. Government of India has set a target of achieving 15 mt by 2022. One of the major constraints in achieving this is lack of skilled manpower and entrepreneurship.

Nearly half of country’s population is below 40 years of age. In order to upgrade their skill, mindset and attract youths towards aquaculture, a focussed and mission mode training program is designed. Apart from talks from the experts from the leading institutes, industry and the progressive farmers, there will be exercises on preparation of bankable projects, finance management, life skills apart from field visits to the successful farms.
